





AUSTRIA / HUNGARY

SCIENTIFIC & TECHNOLOGICAL COOPERATION (formerly WTZ programme) CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR JOINT PROJECTS in 2018-2019

CLOSING DATE: 15 April 2017

The programme for Scientific & Technological Cooperation is carried out in the frame of the bilateral "Agreement between the Republic of Austria and the People's Republic of Hungary from 29th May 1969" and is financed equally by the Austrian Federal Ministry of Science, Research and Economy (BMWFW) and by the National Research, Development and Innovation Office of Hungary.

Aims of the Programme

- Funding researchers' mobility in the frame of joint research projects in specified research fields to stimulate international research cooperation;
- Providing an opportunity for researchers to cooperate in an international setting and to develop their scientific careers, especially for early-stage¹, mid-career² as well as female researchers.

Areas of Cooperation

Joint research proposals may be submitted in the following thematic areas:

- Life sciences
- Agriculture
- Engineering
- Biotechnology
- Environment
- Energy

Projects from natural, technical and social sciences as well as humanities will be considered for funding.

Duration of projects

The projects will be supported for a period of max. two years from January 2018 until December 2019.

Who may apply?

AUSTRIA: Researchers working at universities, universities of applied sciences and other legal entities (e.g. higher education and research institutions, companies) planning to carry out a non-profit-oriented research project within the frame of this call are eligible for application.

Project proposals submitted by early-stage¹ or mid-career researchers² as well as project proposals with involvement of PhD/doctoral students, early-stage¹ and/or female researchers will be particularly considered.

The focus of the programme lies on new international partnerships. Follow-up proposals with the same research partners will not be eligible for funding if they have already been funded under this programme.

¹ Researchers with an experience up to 5 years after their PhD/Doctoral degree; recognized career breaks will be taken into account (e.g. due to family reasons, health reasons or occupation outside the academic sector).

² Researchers with an experience of 5 to 15 years after their PhD/Doctoral degree; recognized career breaks will be taken into account (e.g. due to family reasons, health reasons or occupation outside the academic sector).

Hungary: Researchers working at business enterprises, public research institutes, universities, non-profit organisations, public foundations.

Young scientists and proposals with a potential to become larger-scale research projects – for example in the frame of Horizon 2020 – enjoy preferential treatment.

How do I apply?

It is up to the applicants to find their own research partners. **Proposals must be submitted both in Austria (OeAD GmbH) and in Hungary (National Research, Development and Innovation Office)**. Proposals which have not been received in both countries will not be considered for funding. The call process is highly competitive therefore application does not guarantee funding.

AUSTRIA: The entire application for the research project must be submitted in English online at [<u>S&T</u> <u>Cooperation</u>]. The application must include the following documents (in PDF format):

- Brief academic CV for each Austrian project member
- List of relevant publications of the last 2 years on the Austrian side
- Project description including the methodological part (3 to 5 A4 pages)
- Brief description of the partner institution
- Short description of the project tasks of ALL project members (Austrian and Hungarian)
- Further cooperation perspective

Hungary:

The proposals must be submitted in Hungarian both electronically and in a printed format. All the necessary attachments are listed in the detailed call description, which is available at the webpage of NRDI Office: www.nkfih.gov.hu.

Which activities may I apply for?

The purpose of this call is to support the mobility of researchers between the participating countries to carry out joint research projects. In this regard, funding will be made available for visits and exchanges of scientists conducting joint research within the above-mentioned thematic areas of cooperation.

The sending state will pay the travel expenses whereas the accommodation expenses will be financed by the hosting state (and vice versa).

In Austria in well-justified cases and only within the granted maximum budget EUR 400.- per project may be applied for consumables (lump sum).

Funding Modalities

Funding will be available for a maximum of two years for **collaborative research projects** jointly developed and completed by researchers on both sides.

Funding Limits

AUSTRIA:

The total sum of **EUR 6,000** per project (**EUR 3,000**. per project per year) can be applied for. The funds can be calculated as follows:

- <u>Travel expenses</u>: EUR 200. per trip for Austrian researchers travelling to Hungary (lump sum).*
 * In case the travel costs are at 50% of the lump sum or below, only the actual costs will be refunded on the basis of provided travel receipts.
- <u>Accommodation expenses</u>: EUR 100. per day for Hungarian researchers travelling to Austria for up to 14 days OR EUR 1,500. per month for long-term visits between 15 days and 3 months maximum.
- <u>Consumables</u>: **EUR 400**. lump sum per project in justified cases as part of the granted maximum budget.

Hungary:

The maximum available budget per project proposal is **2 000 000 HUF** (approximately 6 500 EUR) for the two year period. The funds can be calculated as follows:

- <u>Travel expenses</u>: Maximum **HUF 250 000** (EUR 800) per flight for Hungarian researchers travelling to Austria. Travelling by car, train or bus is encouraged. Only actual costs will be reimbursed based on receipts (or cost calculation in case of cars).
- <u>Accommodation expenses</u>: HUF 30 000 (EUR 100) per day for Austrian researchers travelling to Hungary for up to 14 days or HUF 300 000 (EUR 1000) per month for long-term visits between 15 days and 3 months maximum.
- <u>Other direct costs</u>: conference fees and translation costs can be reimbursed in accordance with the conditions of the call.

Please note:

- Should you be successful you will be funded only for the activities within the scope of the guidelines;
- Scientific and financial reporting on the project is **OBLIGATORY**.

How are applications evaluated?

Following the closing date of the call indicated below, applications will be submitted to recognized national experts in the various fields of research represented by the proposals received. These experts will evaluate each proposal based on the following criteria:

- Scientific quality of the intended research project incl.
 - Feasibility of the joint research plan
 - Adequacy of the scientific method
 - Competence and expertise of the scientists/research teams involved (max. 25 points)
- Plausibility of the described further cooperation perspective (max. 15 points)

Project proposals submitted by early-stage or mid-career researchers (10 points) OR project proposals with the involvement of doctoral students, early-stage (5 points) or female researchers (5 points) will receive up to 10 points additionally. (max. 10 points)

Following national evaluation, a joint shortlist of projects to be funded will be constituted through consultations between the OeAD GmbH and the National Research, Development and Innovation Office based on the results of the national evaluations. The project selection will be carried out by the Austrian-Hungarian Joint Committee on Scientific and Technological Cooperation. The results of the project selection meeting will be announced presumably by December 2017.

Projects follow-up and reporting

- A final scientific and financial report has to be submitted in English by both the Austrian and the Hungarian project leaders no more than 3 months after the end of the project.
- The report has to mention outputs of the projects compared with the objectives and aims of the proposal.
- The final report must include a short, concise summary comprehensible to lay persons. The final report will be made available to researchers within this programme in similar disciplines.
- Joint publications by researchers have to mention the support from BMWFW and National Research, Development and Innovation Office of Hungary.

Intellectual property

The researchers of each country must take adequate steps to ensure protection and sharing of the intellectual property that could result from the joint projects.

Closing date for applications

Applications must be submitted by **15 April 2017**. Applications received after this date will not be considered for funding.

Please note that the OeAD GmbH and the National Research, Development and Innovation Office of Hungary will not be held responsible for applications that were not received. Researchers are also advised to ensure that their research partners' applications are submitted and have also been received in the partner countries in time.
