This professorship is meant to position and nurture the "Design Theory and Practical Design" field of research in an international context for design, artistic research and teaching. It is expected that applicants will have theoretical and artistic/practical qualifications in the field of design theory and architectural design. A special emphasis is placed on close association with other fields of knowledge and design relating to architecture, as part of a basic understanding of inter-disciplinary teaching.

The duties of a university professor at TU Wien include, in addition to research, teaching activities (in German and in English) in the Bachelor, Master and PhD programmes, as well as collaboration in the management of the institute and the faculty. The future incumbent will be expected not only to have relevant teaching experience but also to show a high level of commitment to research-led academic teaching, which, given the large size of the university, requires the development of corresponding subject teaching models to convey the basics of architectural design. Expertise and openness to interdisciplinary collaboration, as well as the ability to work in a team, are also required.

Profile of requirements:

- Completed doctoral or PhD studies corresponding to the deployment described from a domestic or equivalent foreign university or research institution or achievement of an equivalent architectural qualification,
- The qualification for lecturing (venia docendi) acquired at a domestic or equivalent foreign university or an academic qualification recognised as equivalent to qualification as a university lecturer,
- Architectural or academic experience relevant to the field of specialisation with national and international reputation, as well as skills in networking,
- Administrative, organisational and social skills, leadership and pedagogic and didactic suitability for academic teaching

- Suitability and willingness to manage a research division or research group,
- Competence and/or experience in the field of gender mainstreaming,
- Proven capacity for interdisciplinary collaboration
- Onsite presence is expected.

In the event of simultaneous applications, these requirements apply to both applicants.

TU Wien offers:

- Motivation letter
- A logical concept for research and research-led teaching at the Faculty, encompassing 5-7 pages; including an abstract

Simultaneous applications should not only include the motivation and reason for the joint application, but should also set out clearly and in detail the qualifications for each of the two applicants. A joint concept for research and research-led teaching in relation to the organisation and management of a research division or group is also required. A single application for a part-time position is out of the question.
